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Physical Connection Overview and Startup

The rear panel I/O port arrangement consists of the following:

Power Input

The RXi2-LP can be powered with a DC power supply of 24 V (+-25%) and at least delivering 1.8 A.

The corresponding plug is a Phoenix Contact, part number 1748367. The user must use the same connector type or equivalent.

Connecting Input Power (24V DC-in)

To connect to power, follow these steps:

- 1. Verify that the power cable is not energized.
- 2. Loosen the screw clamps on the mating power connector.
- 3. Strip the insulation from the power cables.
- 4. Secure the power cable to the mating connector, noting polarity, and tighten the screw clamps. The torque for the attaching screws is 0.3 Nm (2.26 in-lb).
- Apply dc power to the unit. During normal startup and operation, the LED status indicator will be solid green during normal operation.
- 6. Once power is applied, the unit will begin initializing.

Note: Be sure to connect a DC power cord to this 3-pin power connector. Using a voltage out of the range may fail to boot the system or cause damage to the system board.

DisplayPort

The RXi2-LP provides one DisplayPort (DP) output. It can be used to directly connect monitors with a DP input or to use standard off-the-shelf adapters to convert DP signals to HDMI or VGA.

Figure 3: DisplayPort




Ethernet Ports

The RXi2-LP provides two 2 Intel® I210IT PCI Express Gigabit Ethernet controllers (4 on larger box module). The LAN ports allow the system board to connect to a local area network through a network hub or router.

For a proper 100/1000 Mbps connection, Emerson recommends a CAT5 cable or better.

USB Ports

The RXi2-LP provides four USB ports. USB1 and USB2 support both USB 3.1 and USB 2.0 specifications.

Audio

The system board is equipped with 2 audio jacks (Line-out and Micin). A jack is a one-hole connecting interface for inserting a plug.

Audio Jack	Description
Line-Out	Line-out This jack is used to connect a headphone or external speakers.
MIC	This jack is used to connect an external microphone.

Initial Startup

For the first startup, it is advisable to connect a monitor, keyboard, and mouse so that boot progress can be observed. For headless operation after the first startup, a directly attached monitor is not required.

Note: Please note that if RXi2- LP is being used without the monitor (in a headless configuration), it will beep three times after powering up. This is a normal condition, informing the user that a monitor is not present.

After making the connections, power on the IPC. A few seconds after powering up, the RXi2-LP IPC system UEFI Firmware banner and Emerson logo will display on the screen. If the user does not see any error messages up to this point, the RXi2-LP IPC is running properly and ready to be configured for an application.

For more information on UEFI Setup, please see the RXi2-LP Hardware Reference Manual (GFK-3187).

If the RXi2-LP came with pre-installed software, the boot process will continue to load the operating system and application software.

Note: If the RXi2-LP IPC does not perform as described above, some damage may have occurred during shipment, or the IPC is not

configured properly. Please contact Emerson for technical support. (Please see the contact information provided at the end of this document.)

RXi2-LP Pre-Installed Software Options

Software Options	Descriptions	
RXI2-LP (No Pre-Installed Software)	The user is responsible for installing an operating system and application software. Please connect the power cable, monitor, USB keyboard, and mouse before powering up the system. Please consult the RXi2-LP Hardware Reference User Manual (GFK-3187) for details on how to change the UEFI boot order and install the operating system.	
RXi2-LP Windows 10	The unit comes with a Windows 10 IoT operating system pre-installed. Please connect the power cable, monitor, USB keyboard, and mouse before powering up the system. Follow the on-screen instructions for configuring Windows OS. Please consult Section <i>Windows 10 Startup</i> for more details.	
RXi2-LP Movicon.NExT	The unit comes with Movicon.NExT software pre- installed. Please connect the power cable, monitor, USB keyboard, and mouse before powering up the system. Please consult Section <i>Movicon.NExT Startup</i> for details.	
RXi2-LP PACEdge	The unit comes with PACEdge software pre-installed. Please consult Section PACEdge Startup for details.	

Windows 10 Startup

RXi2-LP with pre-installed Windows 10 Operating System, when powered up for the first time, will start with standard self-guiding Windows screens and dialogues, allowing the user to configure username, password, geographical location, and keyboard layout.

Movicon.NExT Startup

The RXi2-LP with pre-installed Movicon.NExT software, when first powered up will start with Windows 10 self-guiding dialogues and configuration options, allowing the user to configure username, password, geographical location, and keyboard layout.

Once Windows operating system has been personalized as desired a Windows desktop will automatically open up. To start Movicon.NExT please double-click on Movicon.NExT icon or go to Start->Movicon.NExT->Movicon.NExT


Figure 6: Movicon NExT Icon



Once started a default window will open up allowing the user to open an existing project or to start new projects. A starting Movicon.NExT window will also have links to Support, Help, Community, Examples, Webinars, and Knowledgebase (Figure 7).

Note: The RXi2-LP with pre-installed Movicon.NExT software also has a pre-installed and ready-to-go software license. To check which features are licensed please go to: **Options->License->Check License.** To enable additional licenses, please contact your Emerson sales representative for the necessary activation key.

PACEdge Startup

This section applies to the units pre-installed with the PACEdge software



PACEdge Usage Model

PACEdge software has two usage models:

- 1) Direct Use Model: Running on the Industrial PC. which has a directly attached Monitor, keyboard, and mouse.
- Headless Use Model: Running on the Industrial PC, which is operating in a headless mode, with the user accessing it remotely via Ethernet using a web interface.

PACEdge in a Direct-Use Configuration

In a Direct-Use case, the user interfaces with the PACEdge system via the monitor, keyboard, and mouse.

Getting Started

- Connect the monitor to the RXi2-LP device by using a DP cable.
 Note: If the monitor of choice has an HDMI or VGA input, use a standard off-the-shelf DP-HDMI or DP-VGA adapter.
- 2. Connect a keyboard and mouse to any of the four USB ports
- 3. Power up the PACEdge unit (please consult the initial startup section for details) and wait until it boots.
- 4. The boot process will pause and ask for login details. Login as admin with password edgestack.
 - **Note**: The user will be asked to change the default password to a unique password at the first login.
- Most interactions with PACEdge are done via a browser-based interface. To get started, click on **Activities->Show Applications** and start the Firefox browser.
- 6. Within the Firefox browser, go to https://localhost
- 7. Proceed to the section entitled *Initial Login*.

PACEdge in Headless Configuration

In a Remote Headless configuration, the user interfaces with PACEdge via Ethernet using a separate device's web browser.

Getting Started

- 1. Connect the Ethernet cable to the Ethernet port labeled ETH0 next to the 24 V power connector on the RXi2-LP.
- 2. Setup the User PC Ethernet port IP address to be statically assigned as follows:
 - a. IPv4 Static IP: **192.168.3.10** (or similar in the same subnet)
 - Netmask: 255.255.255.0
- 3. Power up the PACEdge unit (please consult the initial startup section for details) and wait until it boots.
- 4. Open the browser of your choice and type in 192.168.3.100 or, if known, hostname.local, in the address bar. In case of the RXi2-LP hardware, the hostname is pacedge-xxxxxx, where xxxxxx are the last 6-digits of the Ethernet MAC address. For instance, if the last six digit of the MAC address are e3c2d9, then unit can be accessed by entering: pacedge- e3c2d9.local.
 - **Note**: All Ethernet ports are also configured to get IP addresses assigned by the DHCP server. This dynamically assigned IP address can also be used to access PACEdge.
- 5. Proceed to the section entitled *Initial Login*.

Initial Login


When the user connects to PACEdge for the first time (using the instructions outlined in **Error! Reference source not found.** or PACEdge in Headless Configuration), a warning message will display due to the self-signed certificate on the unit. The message will state that the identity of the device could not be confirmed. Click on Advanced and Accept to proceed.

Note: Please consult the PACEdge User Manual, Security Certificate Management section for details on how to setup the PKI and access PACEdge using the hostname instead of the IP address

Please read and accept the Emerson End User License Agreement (EULA).

Once the EULA has been accepted, the user will be redirected to the Password Management screen. PACEdge software consists of multiple software tools and applications, each having its user management and password settings. To simplify this task, PACEdge comes with pre-configured users: admin, developer, service, and operators, each having its own password. Use the Password Management screen to change passwords for all PACEdge Applications and for Cockpit/Linux (Figure 9). Error! Reference source not found.

When changing the passwords, follow the instructions on the screen and consult the Help button accessible via the question mark button in the upper right corner. **Note**: For both, cybersecurity reasons, and for proper user account setup, the user <u>must</u> change the default passwords at the first login.

Please consult the PACEdge Secure Deployment Guide (GFK-3197) for recommended password changes and other cybersecurity-relevant settings.

Once the passwords have been changed, click on the Emerson logo in the upper-left corner. The logo is a shortcut to the PACEdge Landing Page (Figure 10), which has further shortcuts to Node-RED, Grafana, Cockpit, Portainer, and other applications. The user can return to the Password Management screen from the PACEdge landing page by clicking **Password Management** in the Settings drop-down list on the right side.

To explore PACEdge, click on Node-RED and log in with:

user: admin

 password: edgestack (or the password that was set on the Password Services page)
